Glenbard names assistant superintendent for business services

Paul O'Malley has been named assistant superintendent of business services in Glenbard Township High School District 87, effective July 1. The Board of Education approved his appointment June 12.

O'Malley has been director of finance and business operations in Ridgeland School District 122 in Oak Lawn since 2005. Prior to that, he was assistant to the assistant superintendent of business operations at Adlai E. Stevenson High School in Lincolnshire and a science teacher at Stevenson.

"I really look forward to working in Glenbard. There are exciting things going on there," O'Malley said. "I am looking forward to working with a great team," he added.

O'Malley has directed and prepared payroll; developed and implemented district budgets; prepared tax levies; prepared salary and benefits projections for negotiations; maintained financial records related to three construction projects; and prepared employee retirement plans, etc.
