Fifty-nine teams participated in Glenbard North High School's fifth annual American Cancer Society Relay for Life and raised \$106,000 for cancer research, education, and programs for cancer patients.

The event was held June 10 and 11 at Glenbard North High School in Carol Stream. Teams decorated campsites, held raffles, and kept walking from 6 p.m. June 10 to 6 a.m. June 11.

With a theme of "A View to a Cure," team members dressed in various movie theme attire, answered trivia questions and won prizes.

At each Relay for Life event, a special luminaria lap is held to honor those who have died and those who are battling cancer. Only the light from hundreds of personalized luminaria bags lighted Glenbard North's stadium while the names of honorees scrolled on a screen.
