Jeff reviewed the list of new novels up for approval. The committee was glad to see more diversity in titles and authors. Jeff explained that the English departments trialed literature circles with more literature choice and it was a huge success, so they will be rolling out more of these next year. The introduction of iPads allow much more flexibility with online books, engaging material, and student choice novels. 6:25	Equal Opportunity Schools (EOS) Update The committee discussed Equal Opportunity Schools (EOS) update that is scheduled to come to the full Board as a discussion item on May 28. After the final data on enrollment is uploaded on May 1, the slides will be prepared to show the final data and gap charts that will be shared with the full Board on May 28. Jeff explained that EOS works to support the School Board Commitment #3 to encourage all students to level up, however, levelling up may or may not include AP tests. The goal is to achieve an AP enrollment rate for low income, Black, and Latinx students that is proportional to that of Medium & Upper Income White & Asian students. Glenbard administrators use the student survey and profile, along with standardized test scores and teacher recommendations to determine who to recruit for first time AP enrollment. They create an outreach list at each school.	Jeff Feucht
