DISTRICT AND COMMUNITY

Glenbard Township High School District 87 is the fourth largest high school district in Illinois. Glenbard District 87 encompasses 45 square miles within DuPage County, a suburban area approximately 30 miles west of Chicago. The communities of Glen Ellyn, Carol Stream, Glendale Heights and Lombard lie within the district's boundaries, along with portions of Bloomingdale, Hanover Park, Addison, Downers Grove, Wheaton and unincorporated areas.

Glenbard District 87's four comprehensive high schools serve students in grades 9-12. These schools are: Glenbard East in Lombard, Glenbard North in Carol Stream, Glenbard South in Glen Ellyn and Glenbard West in Glen Ellyn.

Of Glenbard District 87's 7,606 students, 39% come from low-income families. The demographic makeup is: white 43.5%, Black 6.7%, Hispanic 30.5%, Asian 15.3%, American Indian 0.8% and two or more races 3.1%.


GLENBARD NORTH HIGH SCHOOL

Technology Center of DuPage is a Career Technical Education (CTE) campus for 24 high schools in DuPage County, IL. 
