DUAL CREDIT OPPORTUNITIES GIVE GLENBARD STUDENTS A HEAD START ON THEIR FUTURES

In Glenbard High School District 87, our overarching mission is to equip our students for success after graduation. One of our main avenues to achieve this goal is expanding early access to college coursework.

Glenbard's free dual credit coursework complements our strong Advanced Placement (AP) program - 67% of the Class of 2024 took one or more AP class in their four years. This early college credit helps reduce tuition costs and speed up the time to college graduation.

Partners with College of DuPage

Our strong partnership with the College of DuPage has been a critical component over the years. Since 2020, Glenbard and COD have offered dual credit general education coursework in:

- English 1101 & 1102: English Composition 1 & 2
- Speech 1101: Fundamentals of Speech Communications
- Math 1218: General Education Math

The dual credit opportunities allow our students to experience early college coursework, taught by Glenbard teachers during the regular school day. Students earn 3 college credit hours per course. These courses are widely transferable for college credit in Illinois and beyond.

Capstone Experiences

Our offerings in career capstone courses are designed to give students a deeper dive into a particular industry or career and earn college credit. Our dual credit capstone courses include:

- Intro to Education: Dual Credit 1100
- School Procedures: Dual Credit 1101
- Intro to Horticulture: Dual Credit 1100
- Intro to Sustainable Urban Agriculture: Dual Credit 2300

Our horticulture students are participating in field-based activities that provide a view of what future employment could look like in the career field. Glenbard students are also helping deliver instructional experiences at middle and elementary schools within our local sender school districts.

Additionally, Glenbard's INCubator program has expanded to all four of our high schools in 2024-25 through Dual Credit Entrepreneurship 1161. In this class, students work in small teams to develop a business idea. Mentors, coaches and the classroom teacher guide them through a hands-on, authentic entrepreneurial experience.

We're excited for our first district-wide entrepreneurship final pitch contest on May 7, 2025, and we're grateful for the continued support from local business experts and entrepreneurs.



Success in Numbers

- Dual credit enrollments increased from 154 in 2020-21, to 2,848 in the 2024-25 school year. This is an equivalent of \$1.3 million in tuition savings for our students and families.
- In 2024, 62% of Glenbard seniors graduated with early college credit a 16% increase over a 4-year span.
- In 2023, 40.3% of Glenbard seniors scored a 3 or higher on AP exams during their 4 years. This mark was significantly higher than the Illinois average (27.5%), and nearly twice the national average (21.7%).

The Glenbard Township High School District 87 Board of Education is pleased to announce the appointment of Glenbard South High School Principal Jessica Santee as Glenbard District 87's next superintendent, effective July 1, 2025. The board approved Santee's appointment on December 16, 2024. Santee will succeed Superintendent David Larson, who previously announced that he will retire at the end of the 2024-25 school year. Larson has been Glenbard's superintendent since 2012.

FACILITY MASTER PLAN - SCHOOL CONSTRUCTION UPDATES

The purpose of Glenbard District 87's Facility Master Plan is to identify and address capital improvement needs at our four high schools, which are between 52 and 102 years old. Voters approved Glenbard's \$183 million facility improvements referendum in March 2024.

The first phase of construction will begin at South in spring 2025, along with East and West in summer 2025. North will receive typical summer improvements before launching into their major addition next year.



BOARD APPROVES TAX LEVY RELIEF WITH \$750,000 ABATEMENT; DISTRICT RECEIVES FINANCIAL RECOGNITION FROM ISBE

In December 2024, the Board of Education approved the tax levy, which included a \$750,000 abatement (reduction) to provide relief to our taxpayers. Over the past three years, the board has approved abatements totaling \$4.25 million – including \$2.0 million last year.

The result of this year's abatement will be a shortfall in the Debt Service Fund, which will be covered by prior year cash reserves. There is no impact on the operating budget and the financial profile score rating. This approach ensures that we are able to fully fund instructional programming while ensuring that we are fiscally responsible to our community.

Glenbard District 87 is committed to fiscal responsibility. We are pleased with the results of the fiscal year 2024 audit. Highlights of the audit are as follows:

- 1. We achieved all major financial objectives:
 - Balanced budget in our operating funds;
 - Strong cash position; specifically, no short-term borrowing was required to meet obligations;
 - Solvency position realized with 197 days cash on hand achieved. This slightly exceeds the target 180 days established by the Illinois State Board of Education (ISBE).
- 2. Our Annual Financial Report indicates that the district achieved financial recognition status from ISBE for the 18th year in a row. Financial recognition is ISBE's highest category of financial strength.

BYRNE NAMED NEXT GLENBARD SOUTH PRINCIPAL

On Feb. 10, the Glenbard District 87 Board of Education appointed Sean Byrne as the next principal at Glenbard South High School, effective July 1, 2025. Byrne will become principal after South Principal Jessica Santee assumes her new role as District 87 Superintendent on July 1.

Byrne has served as Glenbard South's Assistant Principal for Instruction since 2021. He was recently recognized in December as Assistant Principal of the Year for the DuPage Region by the Illinois Principals Association.

As principal, I plan to foster an environment where all students are empowered to reach their full potential, faculty an staff are supported in their professional growth, and the community is engaged in our school's success. We have an incredible team at Glenbard South and I am truly humbled by the opportunity to lead our continued growth."

Superintendent David Larson said, "Mr. Byrne's credentials and qualities as an educator make him an ideal fit as South's principal. He has wide-ranging and successful experiences as an assistant principal, department chair and

teacher. We are excited to welcome him to the leadership team here in Glenbard."
