	Summer School Update The committee reviewed and discussed the Dual Credit program update presented by LeViis Haney. Glenbard summer school 2025 programming offered courses that included credit recovery, get ahead credit, bridge, enrichment, EL and ESY. Highlights from Summer School 2025 ● 76% of summer school 2025 teachers were from Glenbard ● 486 students registered to take 568 credit recovery courses ● 316 students registered to take 343 get ahead credit courses ● 642 students registered to take 934 bridge or enrichment courses Focus areas for Summer School 2026 ● Offer credit recovery course options for 9th graders ● Recruit more talented Glenbard teachers ● Offer a variety of "get ahead" credit courses so students can have more flexibility in their schedules	LeViis Haney
